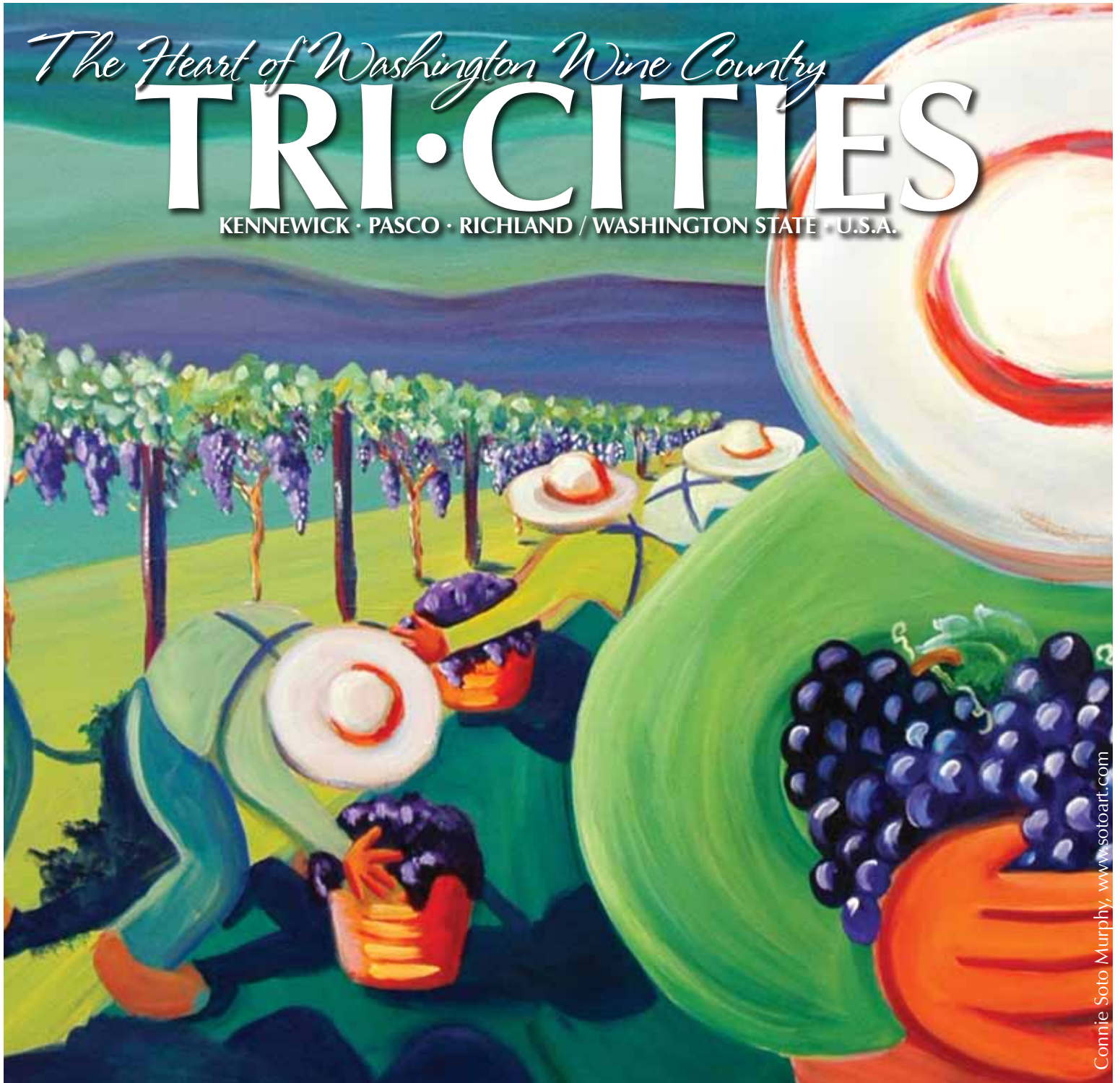

The Heart of Washington Wine Country



When visiting Washington Wine Country, stay in the Tri-Cities and experience the Columbia Valley, Red Mountain, Walla Walla, and Yakima Valley American Viticultural Areas (AVA).

The Tri-Cities lies at the Heart of Washington Wine Country. With 99% of Washington's wine grapes grown in the Columbia Valley, visitors have the opportunity to visit wineries that sit within their vineyards; offering more than just a storefront experience. Chat with the owners, many of whom are on-hand on a daily basis; ask the winemaker questions about procedure while touring the production facility; and walk through the vineyards to get a true experiential visit.

And, the Tri-Cities is located between Yakima and Walla Walla, making a stop nearly impossible while exploring the area's rich wine history. The Tri-Cities sits approximately one hour, fifteen minutes from Yakima, one hour from Walla Walla, 30 minutes from Prosser, and Red Mountain is no more than five minutes away from our western-most city, Richland.

While in the Tri-Cities, endless opportunities await, offering a visitor experience that is second to none: visit the Hanford Reach National Monument, hit the links at one of our ten area golf courses, soak up the sun on one of three rivers, shop in our specialty shops, view masterpieces at our art galleries, experience the history of the area at our museums, and learn about the area's wildlife or Lewis and Clark's visit to present-day Sacajawea State Park.
